Location: Kurri Kurri is a classic designed country town of the early 1900's situated in the centre of the Hunter Valley close to the port of Newcastle and its world famous beaches, yet at the same time just a short drive from the world famous Hunter Valley Vineyards. Established to service the rapidly growing coal mining industry of the Hunter, it has flourished to now become a key town in the area, providing quality living close to the city of Newcastle and the towns of Maitland and Cessnock, Kurri Kurri is an easy drive to Sydney via the Hunter Expressway and M1 Motorway.

Kurri Kurri has a revitalised shopping area and several new subdivisions have been established, with many fine modern homes, contrasting but complementing the simple charm of cottages in the earlier sections of the town.

Kurri Kurri is part of the Cessnock Local Government area within the Hunter Valley. The Hunter Valley wine-growing area is Australia's oldest wine region and one of the most famous. The vineyards of Pokolbin, Mount View and Allandale, with their rich volcanic soils tended by entrepreneurial vignerons, are also the focus of a thriving tourism industry.

Support infrastructure now includes two hospitals, two TAFE campuses, community health services, a range of childcare options, and aged care as well as numerous other community support services. Each of the City's towns and villages (which are linked by large expanses of natural vegetation) provide high quality sporting facilities and parks.

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
